District Goals

- Achievement Goal 1: Increase the percentage of students reading proficiently on local and state assessments by May 2023.

School Goals

The 3rd grade classroom teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in literacy and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Allow students media center access to check out books
- > Provide math drill practice
- Provide opportunities to respond to text in all content areas
- Provide vocabulary lists to students in all content areas

At Home

Toccoa Elementary parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in literacy and math. Families may have other ideas to add to this list:

- Monitor students reading 20 minutes daily
- Review vocabulary words nightly with student
- > Drill student on math facts daily
- Ask student questions about his/her reading

Toccoa Elementary School Students

Toccoa Elementary students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in literacy and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- > Read 20 minutes nightly to a family member
- > Learn and practice basic multiplication facts through 10
- > Ask a family member to ask you questions about your reading
- > Improve comprehension skills through learning of content area vocabulary
